

In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the December 13, 2023, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Community Recognition: Oasis High School Girls Volleyball

City Council and the City Manager recognize the exemplary achievements of Cape Coral residents. The Oasis High School Girls Volleyball team won the state title at the Sunshine State Athletic Association State Volleyball Championship this past Fall. The Sharks were the lowest-ranked team in the state tournament and proved doubters wrong after sweeping Merritt Island Christiaan School in the title match.

Council Approves Turnkey Management of Coral Oaks Golf Course

Council approved Resolution 340-23, hiring Indigo Sports, a subsidiary of Troon Golf, to manage and operate Coral Oaks Golf Course. Troon Golf's operation of Coral Oaks will be directed and overseen by Regional Operations, as well as additional support from personnel based at Troon Golf offices in Reston, VA, and Scottsdale, AZ.

Council Approves Purchasing Lot for Future Boat Ramp

City Council approved Resolution 344-23, approving the purchase of a lot at 2221 SW 17th Street for a future boat ramp site within the City's Freshwater Canal Basin No. 19. The Public Works Environmental Resources and Stormwater Divisions perform water quality sampling and maintenance activities and need access to the canal basins.

Council Approves MOU between Waste Pro and City

City Council approved Resolution 347-23, approving a Memorandum of Understanding and Mutual Release between the City of Cape Coral and Waste Pro, which shall serve as the final settlement.

Council Appoints Rich Carr to District 4 Seat

City Council appointed applicant Rich Carr to the vacant District 4 Councilmember seat, and the City Clerk swore in Carr.
